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PRIZE GIVING DAY 2016-2017

The Principal, Mrs. Yeung, kicked off the proceedings with her welcoming speech followed by the prize presentation by the members of our School Management Committee and Parents-Teachers' Association.

Prizes and certificates were presented to proud students who attained excellent results in the half-yearly examination, as well as to their parents, whose relentless effort in supporting their children in their academic endeavours was much appreciated.



There were talks prepared on different topics for parents and students. There was a talk on Healthy School Programme for S1 and S2. For S3 and S4 there was a briefing on Senior Secondary Elective Subjects and on Applied Learning respectively. S5 students were enlightened by a sharing on

Multiple Pathways by the alumni of the school.

To round off a fantastic day of celebration, there was a barbecue organised by the PTA which was replete with assorted meats, vegetables, and fruits for our parents, teachers and students to enjoy.

The 2nd and 3rd Staff Development Day

The first ever Joint Government School Staff Development Day, held on 24 January 2017 at MacPherson Stadium, was embraced by the teaching staff of 31 government secondary schools.

Two renowned scholars, Professor Joseph J.Y. Sung, JP, Dean of the Chinese University and Dr. Yu Tak Shun Charles enlightened us on the theme of 'Understanding Learners of Today, Cultivate Leaders of Tomorrow'. Professor Sung shared with us his passion on teaching and the insight gained after SARS in 2003. He reminded teachers of today to share more of their personal values and life experiences with students. Peaceful, rational and effective communication enhances the cultivation of the leaders of tomorrow. Dr. Yu shared with us a case of a youngster who was lost while searching for his own values and direction. To help our students excel, teachers need to be more accepting and understanding.



'Share Your Ways, Shine Our Stage: Teaching Excellence Sharing' was the theme of the afternoon session. Teachers attended different sharing sessions in four government schools. Our school was responsible for two presentations in Queen Elizabeth School. They were 'Other Languages' and 'Multiple Pathways'. In the session of 'Other Languages', Ms Josephine Chung introduced to other fellow teachers the adoption of two European languages in SEK while Mr Iqbal Kashif and Mr Kumar talked about teaching Urdu and Hindi. Ms Sham Shuk Yee shared with them a tailor made Chinese curriculum for NCS students.

In the 'Multiple Pathways' sharing, Mr Ngan Kit Yan and Mr Singh Manpreet described the different pathways for the ethnic minority students while Mr Lin Chi Heng talked about Sports Science related pathways our students had taken.

Their sharing was very much enjoyed by the colleagues in the other government schools.

The 3rd Staff Development Day was held on 19 May with a focus on evaluation and planning.



The highlight of the day, however, was the workshop on Music Therapy. The most eye catching sight was the stage in the School Hall loaded with musical instruments like guitars, tambourines, rainsticks and gongs. Ms Angel Leung from Hong Kong Music Therapy and Counselling Association first gave a thorough explanation of the difference between Music teaching and Music therapy. We were then requested to express our feelings through body movements and the use of musical instruments. Some colleagues even showed their talent in song lyric



writing. Through these activities, according to Ms Leung, therapeutic effects could be experienced or witnessed. It was a pity that we could not try out all the activities but a lot of insights were already gained by the fellow teachers.

S6 Graduation Assembly

The S.6 Graduation Assembly was held on 1 March 2017. Concluding our students' 6 years of hard work, it marked the end of their secondary education and the beginning of a new stage in life.

A record breaking number of 115 parents and family punctually arrived at SEK School Hall. The S6 procession, being led by the Principal, Mrs. Yeung, marched in the school hall looking smart and proud. Overwhelmed by the scene, fellow students in S4 and S5 applauded and wished the graduates good luck. Parents' eyes were welled up with tears as emotions gushed out from their hearts.



The ceremony was solemn and full of sentiment. The Principal gave a touching and encouraging speech, which won a lot of applause from the audience. Then each S6 class teacher was invited on stage to share their feelings towards the class and give them a few words of encouragement. The students in each class were then called on stage individually. They were admitted by the Principal with the edge of the cap touching their heads. After taking the class photos, most of the students retreated. 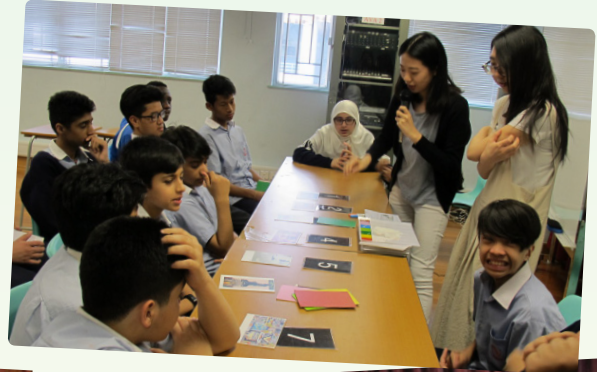
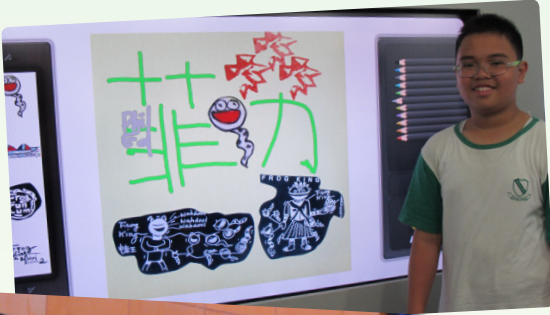
Our Moral & National Education Ambassadors have greatly benefited from this programme as they learnt how to promote an activity.

Humanities Fortnight 2017

With more and more students joining Air Cadet team even in the middle of the school term, Hong Kong Air Cadet Corps 601 Squadron (HKACC 601) has become much stronger.

The cadets of our School participated in various community services, including crowd management duties, guard duties, flag raising duties, visits to elderly homes and organizations related to aviation industry, etc. A record high number of members participated in the HKACC Annual Parade, with 3 of them in the Guard Team while another 3 in the 6 Wing Teams. The ESTP members were assigned a task to hold regular meetings after the challenge camp, which they did. Members took turn to organize meetings to discuss team activities and matters. Many of them did it well and a lot of meaningful discussions were held. The regular meeting proved to be very useful when the team was asked to promote different positive values amongst their schoolmates. Project SHINE is a mentoring and capacity building project. It was co-organized with TREATS, Outward Bound and PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC). PwC is a well-known international leader in accounting, assurance, tax and advisory services. Being the largest professional service firm in the world, it is one of the Big Four auditors in the world. Five S5 students from our school participated in this project together with students from other secondary schools. They started the project in July 2016. Different training workshops, a 5-day adventure leadership training camp and internship in PwC were organized. The project was a valuable real-life working experience for participants to develop their social network and widen their horizons and perspectives. Among all participants, only 4 were selected for the more intensive Phase 2 Internship (over 80 hours) in PwC. As a testament to our outstanding students, 2 of them were from our school. They started their second placement in PwC during the last Christmas Holidays. All in all, this project gave our students a rare opportunity to have a better understanding of a global business company and some of them started planning to study accounting and business administration in university. Save the Earth

Three S2 students joined the Kids4Kids Act!on for a Cause Pitching Competition and became one of the winning teams. In 2017, mentors from Kids4Kids supported the team by providing information and suggesting ideas, helping the team to put the project into real action.

In March, the team carried out phase one of the project. They made some upcycling artwork with the materials collected in school such as earrings made from paper, bracelets and chokers made from soda can tabs, roses made from soda cans and candle holders made from disposed plastics spoons. The group showed their creativity and skills in upcycling unused materials into artwork. 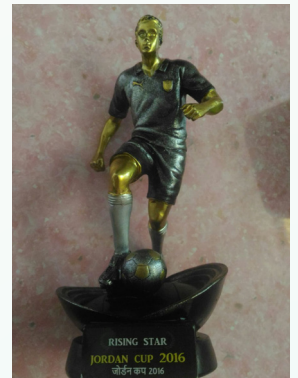

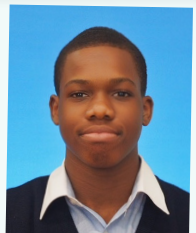

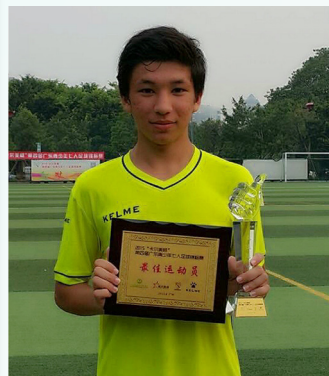
