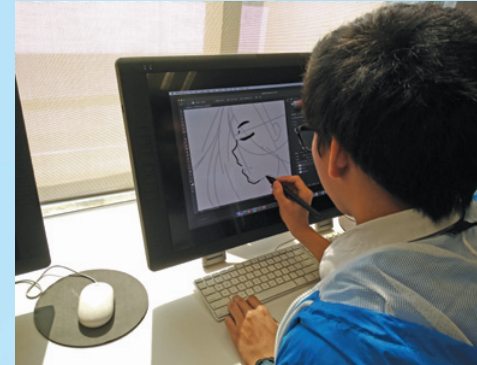
Animation Workshop at SCAD

National Educational Committee of our school organized a talk for junior form students on Internet indulgence titled 'Ethical Fun Net – Safety Use of Internet' on 2 May 2018.

The talk aimed to help raise awareness of Internet use and the risks involved in using it. The talk instilled in students' minds a healthy, safe and ethical way of using the Internet. Besides that, students were made to understand the importance of efficient time management while using the Internet. Topics like cyber bullying and its prevention and 'Control of Obscene and Indecent Articles Ordinance' were also brought to the attention of the students.

It is expected that with a consciously taught informal curriculum like instilling values like responsibility, respect etc., and teaching students to make informed decisions and exercise self-discipline, the probability of teenagers benefitting from the use of the Internet is far greater than the harms they are exposed to.



Mastering Your Life

This year, the Lions Club of Wanchai conducted a one-year program, namely “Mastering Your Life (Magic Training)” for our senior form students. Mentors from the club shared their life stories through a series of magic training and helped students establish a proper attitude towards life. Subsequently, they organized three workshops to introduce the professions of legal practice, insurance and accounting to our students. In addition, company visits to a famous noodle-making factory and a logistic company were arranged for students so as to let them experience life at work. An award presentation was held in which scholarships were awarded to the students with outstanding performance.



Multicultural Dream Pursuit



Our school has participated in the Multicultural Dream Pursuit Project for three consecutive years. The project was sponsored by EDB and implemented by Caritas, with the aim of helping senior form students to pursue their own dreams. With reference to their interests, the social worker arranged three visits to different companies and tertiary institutions. S6 Graduation Dinner 2017/2018

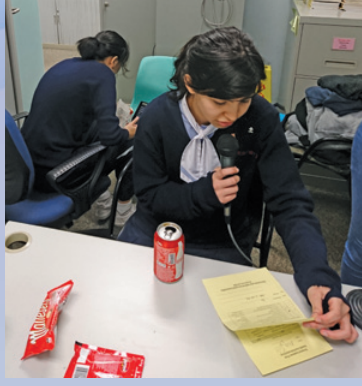
12 May 2018 was the day for the graduating students of our school to celebrate their graduation and the event was held at the Regal Oriental Hotel in Kowloon City.

Snapshots of activities

1. "Here and now" Drama Show 「愛在當下」生命劇場



Students were particularly active in the interaction session and willing to share their opinions. All S1-S5 students attended this drama show on 31 January 2018 and learnt the importance of caring for others and observing others' emotions in communication.

A workshop was conducted for S2 on 2 February 2018 to reflect on what they had learnt in the drama. The S2 students

were asked to think of different ways to show concern for others and practise how to put ideas into action.



2. "Happiness is around the corner" – School-based Caring Action 「快樂就在轉角」校本關懷行動



A group of 15 Love and Care Ambassadors planned, prepared and organized lunchtime game booths on the topic of Positive Psychology on 19 Dec 2017 and 17 May 2018. They spread positive messages through entertaining and educational games to the participating students. The

Guidance teachers and class teachers worked together to conduct the lessons to teach students positive communication methods for building up a better interpersonal relationship.



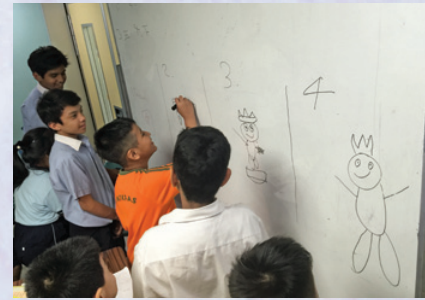
Service Project with Baptist Oi Kwan Social Service

Joint-school Programmes with Kowloon Technical School

1. Service Project

The science departments and the Service Education Committee of our school and Kowloon Technical School (KTS) co-organized a cross-curricular programme for our students, entitled “Joint-school Service Project”.

The aims of the project were to enhance students’ interest and confidence in learning science and offer life-wide learning opportunities to broaden students’ horizons and encourage them to take part in various voluntary work.

Since the students from our school are of multi-cultural background, the project allowed students of both schools to recognize the culture of different ethnic groups and delivered the message of cultural harmony.

The project consists of two-day workshops and one service day. On the first day at KTS, ice-breaking games related to science were introduced to students to warm up and know each other. After that, they worked collaboratively to prepare the light-sensitive material and painting. On the second day at our school, they made a crystal tree and electroplated objects cooperatively. They also tried an interesting experiment, Jumping Sodium. Students from both schools all showed interest in doing the experiments.



It was followed by the highlight of the project, which was the service day. Students from both schools visited the Elderly Centre of Self Help Group for The Brain Damaged together. Through a number of interactive games and activities, the students got to understand the importance of health and positive attitude towards life, the uniqueness and diversity among people, and also the value of serving our community.

In short, this inspiring joint-school project not only helped students to increase their confidence and interest in learning science, but also developed their generic skills and enriched their learning experience outside the classroom, especially life and service education.

Techno-ride of Kadoories in ATEC

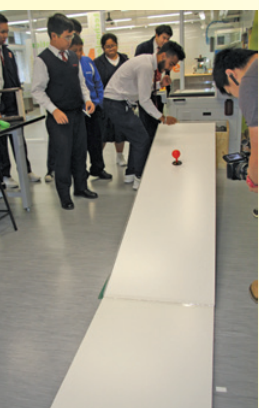
